Mark Your Calendars for Sept 14: Planning Commission Hearing on Greenway

Please plan to attend the Planning Commission's public hearing on the Southeast Greenway project on Thursday, September 14, 2017, at or after 4:00 PM, in the City Council Chamber, City Hall, 100 Santa Rosa Avenue, Santa Rosa. The purpose of this hearing will be to receive public comment and recommendations on the Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR), General Plan Amendment and Rezoning for the Southeast Greenway.



What's it all about?

The EIR, now available to the public at www.planthegreenway.com, examines the potential significant environmental impacts of the Southeast Greenway project – a long term plan that will guide development of the 57 acre property over an 18 year horizon that is consistent with the Santa Rosa General Plan 2035. It provides a description of the project and addresses important considerations such as:

- Aesthetics (view corridors)
- Biological Resources (native vegetation, creeks, wetlands, wildlife)
- Greenhouse Gas Emissions
- Hydrology and Water Quality (potential run off and water use)
- Land Uses (parking demand, development, neighborhood impacts)
- Housing (increased density)
- Public Services (safety, schools, recreation)
- Transportation and Circulation (traffic impact, pedestrian access, bike connections)

We suggest reading the Project Description and one or two areas that interest you.

Why is it important to comment and attend?



If past experience is an indicator, we can anticipate that the EIR review process will bring out project critics. Thus it is imperative that supporters articulate the benefits of the Greenway project, as well as its potential impacts, and communicate these benefits and our support to the City's Planning

Department and Planning Commission.
