Yes on 68 for parks, water, and land

Your vote this June can benefit our community parks, open spaces and waterways. The SE Greenway Campaign urges you to vote YES on Prop. 68.



With voter approval, the measure will invest \$4 billion in the coming years to address our parks and recreation, natural resources, water and flood control needs.

The proposition favors upgrading smaller neighborhood parks, protecting local greenways and open space and cleaning up polluted riverbanks and groundwater supplies, largely in urban and suburban areas. Yes on Regional Measure 3 for transportation improvement

The SE Greenway Campaign urges you to vote YES on Regional Measure 3. Should voters in each of the nine Bay Area counties approve this ballot measure in June, it will finance a comprehensive suite of transportation improvements to help solve the Bay Area's growing congestion problems.

Sonoma County projects include upgrades to improve State Route 37 in Marin, Sonoma, Napa and Solano counties and extending the new SMART rail system to Windsor and Healdsburg. The bill also includes a \$150 million grant program to improve bicycle and pedestrian access to regional transit hubs and to close gaps in the San Francisco Bay Trail.
